Training

Stage 2 – Offshore Crane Operator

Stage 2 training should follow as soon as is practicable after Stage 1 training. This training aims to give the Trainee Crane Operator hands-on training in the offshore crane that he will be expected to operate.

On completion of stage 2 the Trainee or Assistant Crane Operator will be restricted to deck work, under supervision of the Installation Crane Operator. If appropriate, and when deemed competent to progress to vessel work (usually after approx 40 hours deck work) he will be reassessed and may then progress to supervised vessel work.

This Training Period Covers:

- Daily maintenance routines
- Pre-start checks
- Understanding of crane and installation safety systems and devices
- Emergency operating procedures
- Machine awareness; safe areas for crane operation
- Ability to work with a Banksman
- Radio procedures
- Routine crane maintenance
- Pre-use checks and inspection
- Operational controls
- Driving ability and attitude towards safe operations
- Crane load charts and safety equipment
- Slings of loads and use of rigging gear
- Knowledge of HSE processes, relevant legislation and approved codes of practice
- Knowledge of JSA

The course is designed to be an assessment of knowledge attained during Stage 1 training. The candidate is assessed at his normal place of work.

Reassessment

It is recommended in BS 7121 Part 11 that Operators are reassessed at intervals of two years.
